Provide your lawn with essential nutrients by applying a fertilizer containing controlled-released nitrogen. Also, discourage lawn insects, weeds, and disease by mowing correctly. Recommended heights include: St. Augustine & Bahia 3/4", Centipede 1.5-2.0", and Dwarf St. Augustine 2.5". Happy Gardening!
